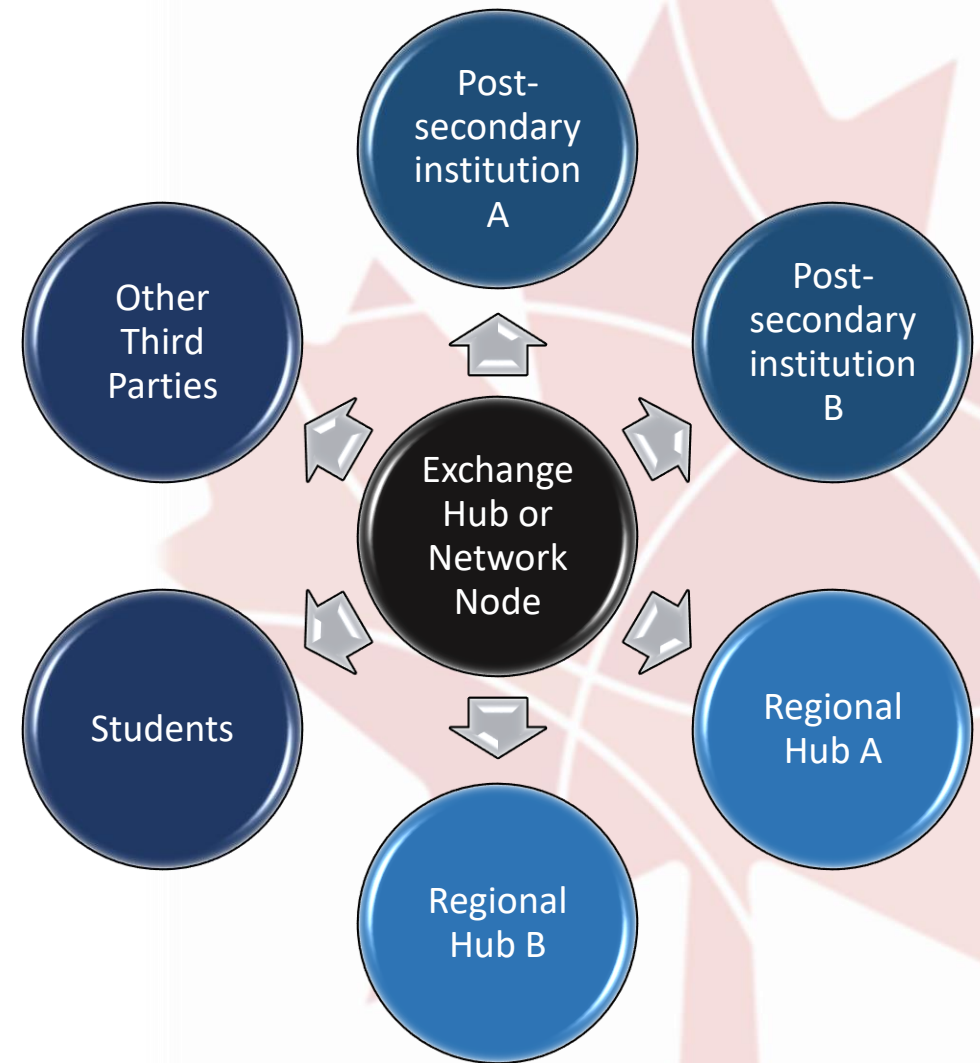

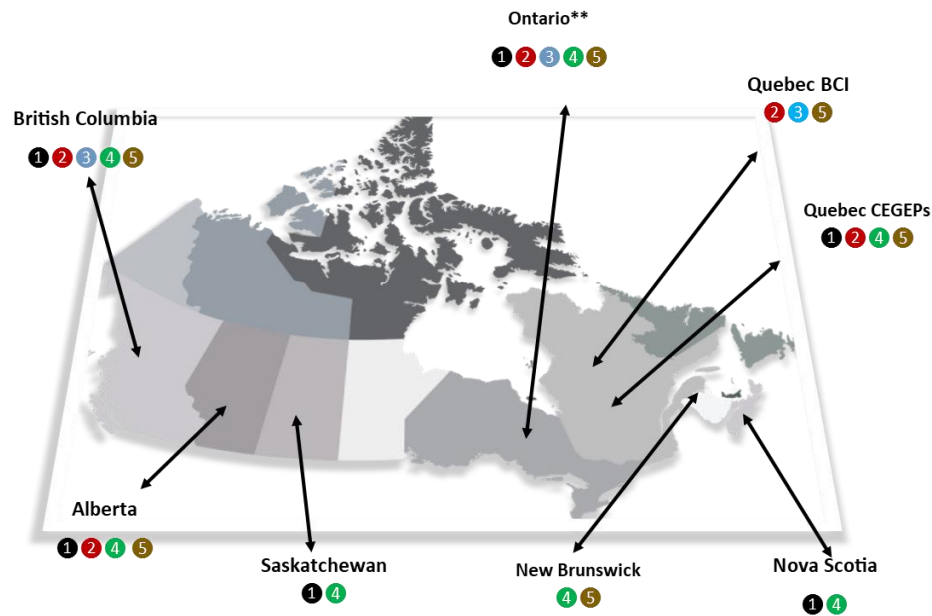

## Funding Brief : Strengths (p.5)



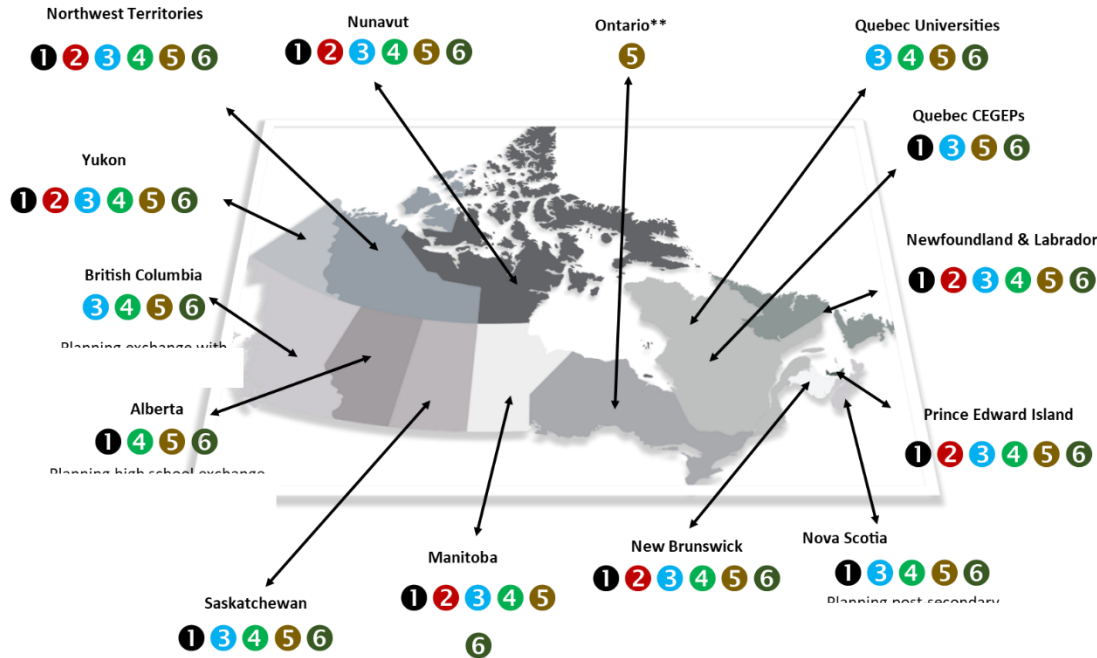

- Some data exchange infrastructure already exists in eight provinces
- Most common are exchange systems for high school transcripts and information on student pathways / credit transfer
- Four provinces have existing data exchange between PSIs
- Three are moving data inter-provincially

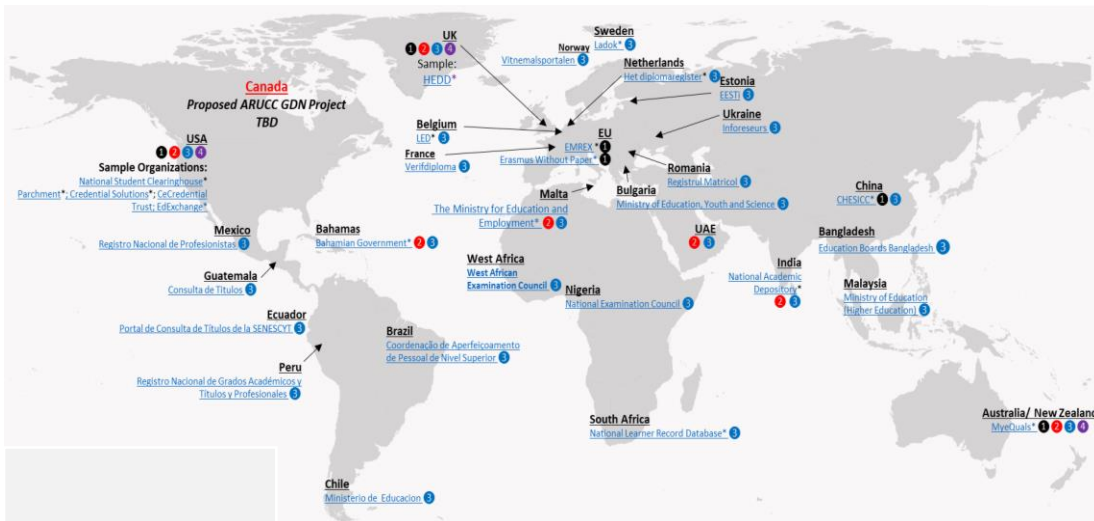

- Most provinces and territories need to add significant services to provide basic student data exchange capacity:
  - Inter-provincial
  - High school or CEGEP
  - Graduate student
  - Non-governmental regulatory bodies
  - Credential verification
- Provinces with PSI data exchange infrastructure need increased capacity to share inter-provincially and internationally



# Aligning with Global Context

Funding Brief: Sample National Services (p.7)



- Five regions host one or more nation-wide data exchange services
- Seven regions host a digital credential exchange service
- Twenty-eight regions host a national level online credential verification service
- Three regions host an online portal or wallet

*Canadian PSIs and students require competitive services to participate more efficiently and effectively in emerging global skills and knowledge networks.*
